It also owns and operates the local NPR music station, 90.9 The Bridge, providing nonprofit radio in a AAA format to listeners over the air and online streaming. Kansas City PBS' nonprofit source for local journalism, Flatland (flatladkc.org) produces multimedia reporting focused on civic affairs, arts and culture, food and drink, and education.
